This wide range of seeds (actually more than 300 varieties) is the result of a 20-years careful and hard work. Our main goal (both for the present and future years) is to keep unchanged the purity of the native standard varieties whose products have always been at the basis of the food of several Mediterranean countries like Italy, Spain, Greece, France and many others more.

As a consequence of the continuous launching of new seed varieties by many breeding companies, this important heritage of the Mediterranean tradition has progressively been neglected and finally put aside. New hybrid varieties have taken places every day more. They certainly are more uniform, more productive and more resistant to diseases, but they also are so anonymous, because they haven't any special history behind them and because they don't belong to the Mediterranean tradition.

Far from this position we have been working only on the old standard varieties: we never changed them, on the contrary we have only been trying to recreate a high-quality stockseed suitable to the multiplication.

We decided to choose among the several Mediterranean varieties only those that meet these three basic requests:

**colour*

**taste*

**tradition*

Among the most important ingredients of our traditional food you'll always find coloured and tasteful vegetables: think at the taste of red San Marzano tomatoes on a delicious "pizza napoletana", or the bright green and intense flavour of basil leaves used to prepare the traditional "pesto alla genovese". And what about the magic of the thousand colours in a mixed salad with chicory, lettuce and rocket?

We produce seeds because it's our job, but also because we are very keen of it. What we strongly desire is to make the Mediterranean varieties be discovered again, appreciated and especially kept for the future.

We produce these Mediterranean varieties in two Italian regions called Emilia-Romagna and Marche. They both have natural weather conditions very suitable to the seed production. Moreover the temperate climate with long hot and dry summers allows us to obtain seed of quality.

We'd finally like to offer this special range of seeds to all companies in the world because we believe they will be very appreciated in a near future.

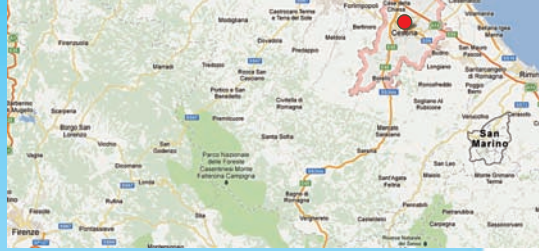

With slight annual variations, ANSEME cultivates its seeds with 1500 growers, on a total area of 5000 hectares of land. Each season production consists in about 3000 tons of hybrid and standard vegetable seeds, which the company exports to more than 50 different Countries. ANSEME grows every year more than 300 different varieties and we are working hard to keep seed purity and improve quality year after year.



ANSEME grows its seeds in several Italian regions: Lombardia, Piemonte, Umbria, Abruzzo and Puglia. Most of our production however is concentrated on the wide plains of Emilia-Romagna extremely suitable for direct sowing and mechanised farming techniques – and the windy, sunny hills of the Marche, south of Emilia-Romagna, ideal for the production of hybrid onions and hybrid cabbages. This is an area known and envied by seed producers all over the world.

We are equipped with modern and efficient machinery. We have eight lines, divided according to types of product, special processing and finishing. This gives us the possibility of wide-ranging fast selection and enables to process both large and small quantities, ensuring 99% mechanical purity and preventing any mixture of different varieties of seeds. Our machine operators benefit from the professional experience, which has been handed down from one generation to the next within the company. This fifty-year experience combines tradition with the most sophisticated technology.
